During January and February, each of the designated areas will hold Area Training Council Meetings under the direction of the Area Vice President. These meetings are designed to help train both old and new board members in their duties, and to promote discussion among board members in their various specialties that can lead to a crossfertilization of ideas. We encourage each chapter president to bring his entire board to this meeting. Members of the Executive Council and the National Program Directors and their committees will be present to assist the Area Vice President in this training.

I look forward to **visiting** as many chapters as I can during the year. I am **excited** with what has been accomplished, and look forward to what will happen during this year.

Also invited are past national presidents and immediate past presidents of these chapters.

The purpose of the meeting is to counsel together about **growth and chapter alignment** in Greater Salt Lake, where a large part of our membership dwells. You are invited to bring your creativity and optimism to this important meeting. **These same chapters will have their area training meeting for all chapter officers at 2:00 p.m. at the National Building the same day.**

NATIONAL KICKS OFF YEAR WITH TRAINING SESSION

Thirteen of sixteen Area Vice Presidents were trained by the Executive Council and the National Program Directors on Saturday, January 6th. The Area Vice Presidents, in turn, will train the members of the chapter boards in six Area Training Meetings in January and February (See the Area Training Schedule in this issue). The training was superb. New SUP Handbooks were distributed. One retired executive, who has attended many training meetings in industry, said "It was great training – among the best training meetings I've ever attended!"

Some Highlights included:

- New National President Jay Smith gave a PowerPoint presentation of his recommended goals for the year. They include:
 - o **2300 members** in 2007. **The goal of 2006 members in 2006 was achieved.** Our year-end membership was 2070!
 - Six new chapters
 - o 120 name memorializations (5 per chapter)
 - Every Chapter has at least one of the Tomorrow's Pioneers programs:
 [Scholarships, Frontier Essays (4th graders), Pioneer Biographies (High School)]

- o Each chapter has at least one trek & is working on a Monument
- Each chapter honors at least one Today's Pioneer
- ➤ Area Vice President Training: AVPs were encouraged to:
 - o Attend chapter board meetings frequently and ask for an early spot on the agenda.
 - o Train chapter presidents by reading and discussing the Handbook materials.
 - Encourage chapter board meetings to be report meetings (with much of the planning being done in chapter committees).
- ➤ Break-out sessions: National Program Directors conducted round-robin break-out sessions on Publications, Public Relations, Treks and Monuments, Tomorrow's Pioneers, Membership, and Pioneer Heritage. The Area Training Meetings will have similar break-out sessions on these topics.

2007 NATIONAL CONVENTION TOURS

Now is the time to plan for an exciting Tour to the 2007 National SUP Convention in Mesa, Arizona, October 17 to 20. We have three professionally conducted tours to choose from. The final cost of these tours depends on participation by SUP members and guests. None of them include the registration for the convention. **Please get your inquiries in early so we can finalize costs and itineraries.**

TOUR #1 originates in Rexburg, Idaho, travels through Utah, stopping at scenic and historic places on the way, such as Salt Lake City, Cove Fort, Mountain Meadow, Pine Valley and St. George, with its many historic places, and on to Kanab. The tour continues to Page, Arizona, Glen Canyon Dam, Lake Powell, Navajo Country, Flagstaff and on to Mesa for the SUP Convention.

After the Convention the tour continues to Yuma, and then on to San Diego for the Mormon Battalion Monument and Museum, San Diego Temple, and continuing on the path of the Mormon Battalion to Sacramento, and Sutter's Mill where the gold rush started. Before returning home, there will be a stop in the Sierra Mountains to remember the ill-fated Donner Party, who contributed much to the Pioneers trek west.

The cost ranges from \$670 to \$880 per person, depending on how many go. Fill the bus and cut the cost. For further information contact Dee Risenmay, (208)-356-5805.

TOUR #2 is conducted from St. George but originates in Ogden or Salt Lake, travels through Utah, stopping at Cove Fort, Iron Mission Museum, Lee's Ferry, Old Las Vegas Fort, Jacob Hamlin home, Brigham Young home, St. George Tabernacle, Temple visitor's center. Southwest scenic sites at Antelope Slot Canyon, Page, Glen Canyon Dam river float, south rim of Grand Canyon and Hoover Dam. There will be a special production at Zion Canyon "Twist the Night Away" and then on to the Mesa Convention. There will be other sights to see on the way home.

TOUR #3 originates in Salt Lake City with an airline flight to Arizona. After the Convention we will travel on to Mexico's fabled COPPER CANYON (a ride in the sky), COLONIAL JUAREZ with its rich LDS culture and history, PAQUIME INDIAN RUINS, MENNONITE CAMPS, PANCHO VILLA'S HOME AND MUSEUM and INDIAN MARKETS are just a few highlights on this fascinating excursion. Add to this, BRIDGES, TUNNELS, TARAHUMARA INDIANS, LOS MOCHIS, COASTAL GUYMAS and HERMOSILLO! Then back to Arizona and the flight home.

Your Spanish speaking guide, Dr. Webb Goodman, will accompany you throughout this journey. Webb is a real joy, is active LDS and has his PhD in Spanish as well as Mexican history and culture. He has escorted many tours into this area and has done several for us at Hyde's Encore Tours and Travel.

Six Chapters have remitted over 50% of their 2007 annual dues renewals.
