

involved with the SUP in many capacities for over thirty years; **Leon Woodfield**, (left) our outgoing Treasurer; outgoing National Program Director



DIAMOND JUBILEE YEAR

The 75th Anniversary of the founding of the Sons of Utah Pioneers will begin with some much needed refurbishing of the Headquarters Building in January. The library and office areas will receive new coats of paint preceding the **replacement** of the well-used carpet. We appreciate the support of Steve Ogden and his company in providing the new carpet at cost. The main floor of the building will be closed for most of January, however, meetings can still be scheduled in the lower floor. Funding for the refurbishing is being provided from the Diamond Jubilee Monument and Building **Improvement Fund.** All members and chapters are invited to contribute to this fund. Three levels of individual giving recognition have been announced by Dil Strasser, Fund and Membership Director:

\$1,500 A 28 inch replica of the "Eyes Westward" statue of Brigham Young and Joseph Smith to be placed at "This is the Place Heritage Park"

\$750 An attractive desk plaque with **a medallion** picturing the Monument

\$75 A Diamond Jubilee Signed Certificate

In addition, a special **Diamond Jubilee patch** will be given to each chapter that donates \$750 to the fund or has 75% of their members donating to the fund.

We are pleased that several of our members and chapters have already made their contributions to the fund. Remember, monies donated to the SUP are **tax deductible**. 2008 MEDALLION IN PRODUCTION

The 2008 Medallion will feature a beautiful picture of the National Headquarters Building taken from the north with the striking furled flag attracting the gaze of I-80 travelers. It will be distinctively identified as the 75th anniversary medallion. It will again be produced in bronze (\$5), silver (\$25), and gold plate (\$30) with a \$2 reduction for orders in excess of ten (10). This is a keepsake medallion SUP members won't want to miss. MINIMUM CHAPTER STANDARDS FOR 2008 CHAPTER AWARDS

Beginning in 2008, a set of minimum standards have been established by the NSSUP National Board in seven areas of emphasis. All chapters that meets these standards will receive a year plaque to place on their chapter banners that will be presented to the chapters in the April Chapter President's Council Meeting. The chapter quarterly reports used in 2007 will again be used in 2008 to help determine which chapters earn the awards. The 2008 chapter minimums are as follows:

1. Pioneer Heritage

Submit **15 Pioneer Name Memorializations** with 1-3 page biographies **AND submit 5 SUP member biographies** (2+ pages). These may be part of a Life Member submission, or an In Memoriam submission.

2. Monuments

Complete, dedicate and document a monument or marker, OR restore, rededicate and document an existent monument and marker, OR clean and upgrade two or more monuments or

markers. For larger projects, two or more chapters may combine.

3. Treks

Plan and take at least **two chapter** treks involving at least **20%** of the chapter members in at least one trek.

4. Chapter Activity

Meet four of the five minimums

- a. Hold at least eight (8) chapter meetings
- b. Hold at least eight (8) chapter board meetings
- c. Produce a **chapter newsletter** for at least **four** issues and send copy to designated *Trail Marker* representative.
- d. Have **two-thirds** of chapter board members at the **January/February** Area Council training meetings
- e. Give at least one **Modern Pioneer Award**

5. Tomorrow's Pioneers

Conduct a **Pioneer Life Essay** program in one or more schools and send copies of the essays to the NSSUP Library, **OR** conduct a **Pioneer Biography** program in one or more chapters and send copies of the biographies to the NSSUP Library, **OR** give one or more **College Scholarships** to High School seniors.

6. Community Service

Provide your community with the equivalent of five (5) hours service per chapter member through **chapter sponsored community projects.** (Includes monument, pioneer, and similar projects.)

7. Membership

Meet two of the three minimums

- a. Recruit **five new members**. (Annual or life)
- b. Convert two annual members to life membership
- c. **Submit 80% renewal** of annual members by **June 30, 2008.**

Awards for the period **July 1, 2006 to December 31, 2007** will be determined based on

the **chapter quarterly** reports for this period. If all six reports have not been submitted, chapters may submit them up to **February 15, 2008.**They awards will be presented in **April 2008** at the Chapter Presidents Council meeting.

CHAPTER NEWS

MAPLE MOUNTAIN (Mapleton, UT) Some details of the November 29th meeting were included in last month's *Trail Marker*, however there is more to be said about the successful meeting. National SUP President, Jay Smith, attended and gave special thanks and recognition to Paul Whiting for leading the establishment of the new chapter. Pres. Smith also mentioned that the chapter was given special honor and recognition at the national convention in Mesa in October.

As previously reported, **Joseph McConkie** was the speaker. He told of some of the thirst, hunger, loss of animals, etc. as the pioneers traveled to settle southern Utah towns and other areas at the Prophet's request. Their movement was not for personal gain but for something greater – to provide a heritage for future generations.

SEVIER VALLEY (Richfield, UT) The chapter is in the fifth year of sponsoring the Heritage **Essay Contest**. The program continues to grow and last year there were seventy six entries. This year Zion's Bank is providing the funds for the contest. They have agreed to give each winning student a voucher that can be used at the bank to open either a savings or checking account. Each class winner will receive \$20.00. The three chapter winners will receive: 1st place \$100.00, 2nd place \$50.00 and 3rd place \$25.00. This great program will, no doubt, motivate the students to participate in researching and writing about one of their ancestors and will also give them a valuable learning experience in saving and money management. BRIGHAM YOUNG (Provo, UT) The speaker for the December chapter meeting was **Buddy Youngreen.** Buddy is the Founder and has been

the president of the Joseph Smith, Sr. Family Association for the past thirty years. His church history-related works include two books and several articles in the Ensign, BYU Studies, Latter-day Digest, and Encyclopedia of Latter-day Saint History.

In his message to chapter members **Ralph Benson**, the 2007 chapter president, quoted Mr.
David McCullouth who further quoted Daniel
Boorstin, stating: "Planning for the future
without a sense of the past is similar to planting
cut flowers and hoping for a beautiful garden"
Mr. McCullough said: "Today the new
generation of young Americans are like a field of
cut flowers, by-and-large historically illiterate.
This does not bode well for our future". Mr.
Benson then wrote: "Hopefully our organization
will do everything in our power to help our
youth to enjoy the pleasure of being rooted in
their pioneer heritage and not become a part of
the 'Cut flower' generation".

MILLS (Southeast Salt Lake City, UT) Guest speakers for the November chapter meeting were Richard Romney, Managing Editor of the New Era in the LDS Church Magazine Department and his wife, Maria Diosado. Richard described many aspects and strengths of the LDS Church Magazine Department. Currently magazines are published in 57 different languages. All stories are reviewed by seasoned people for accuracy and content. The mission of the magazines is to chronicle the living history of the church and its people. Richard's wife is of Spanish ancestry but was raised in France. She told of her teen years and of being introduced to the LDS church in 1986 by her neighbors. She bore testimony of her belief in a living prophet.

Music for the evening was provided by **Greg Larsen** who played a litany of American songs.
The December chapter meeting was hosted by **Frank Madsen and his wife Connie**. They arranged to have the **Utah Chamber Choir** perform for the dinner meeting.

CANYON RIM, SUGARHOUSE AND BEEHIVE (Northeast Salt Lake Valley) The program for the December meeting was hosted

by the **Pioneer Heritage Chapter.** The program was the **Skyline High School Madrigals** celebration of the Christmas Spirit.

Each year the University of Utah selects nominated military veterans to be honored during a special ceremony. This year eleven WW II veterans were honored for their enormous contributions. One of the group was Luman P. Slagle of the Canyon Rim chapter. Mr. Slagle entered the army in 1942 and landed on Normandy two days after D-Day. With his unit he advanced through France and was involved in the capture of the Remagen Bridge. He is a recipient of the Silver Star.

SALT LAKE PIONEER (Salt Lake City, UT) The special speaker for the January meeting will be someone from the office of Mr. Dale Bills, Director of Communication and Marketing for the new City Creek Center (the \$1 billion shopping center development under construction in downtown Salt Lake City). The speaker will share stories and insights regarding this monumental project.

CEDAR CITY (Cedar City, UT) Cedar City's Pioneer Messenger newsletter contained a brief report of the National convention, including the election of **Roger Flick as President-elect** for 2008 and new criteria in the Awards Program. Those of the chapter who attended felt it was a very successful conference.

President Joe Bishop encouraged the members to preserve the memories of their pioneer ancestors by memorializing their names on the walls of the National Headquarters building and by writing their biographies (and your own life story) and submit them to the chapter. Those which have been submitted are on file in the city library, the University library and at the National Headquarters.

TEMPLE FORK (Logan, UT) The November program was presented by **Music Theatre West**. Those present for the meeting were given a preview of the musical "**The King and I**", which Music Theatre West will be performing at the Ellen Eccles Theater in January.
