At our 2008 National Encampment/Convention held at Richfield this past year, Dil Strasser was elected President-Elect for the year 2009. The Richfield Encampment was one of the best ever. In December 2008, we held training sessions for the Area Vice Presidents (AVP's); now in January 2009, the AVP's will be holding training sessions for all chapter board members.

(below) such as forts, river crossings, a brick kiln, etc. The chapter has done a good job of locating the monuments and markers (below) in their county and this trek made the group more aware of where these are and the significance they played in the history of the area. For a service project the chapter has donated money to the **Zambia Scholarship Fund**. The native people of the Zambia villages are very poor and don't have opportunities for education. This fund supports teachers and students so the standard of living can be elevated. The chapter donation will

provide \$100.00 per month for a teacher and \$25.00 per month for one young student for the year.

BRIGHAM YOUNG (Provo, Utah). With the merger of the George Albert Smith and the Brigham Young Chapters a big new effort was launched to improve the SUP Pioneer Village at Souette Park in Provo. Under the energetic direction of Steve Nelson, unofficial "Mayor", 2,000 hours of volunteer effort were spent in the year 2008. The community raised \$15,000 to install a beautiful new wrought iron fence around the expanded area and to acquire and construct a number of new displays. Many exhibits and one cabin were cleaned, repaired and rebuilt. Descriptive brochures were printed, newspaper articles were published and several special events for community and youth groups were hosted. A special celebration on July 24th was a success. A pioneer band performed each week. Participating docents volunteered over 400 hours. The SUP Pioneer Village in Provo is now "on the map!" (Some of this activity regarding the park has been reported in the Trail Marker during the year but this report by Angus **Belliston** summarizes it very well.)

CANYON RIM -SUGARHOUSE (Southeast Salt Lake and Sugarhouse, Utah) The Twin chapters were joined for the Christmas party by the Pioneer Heritage chapter. The Sugarhouse chapter arranged for the program and the group enjoyed the singing of the Beehive Statesman Chorus. This group is part of the prestigious Barbershop Harmony Society.

CEDAR CITY (Cedar City, Utah) A very special musical program was provided for the chapter's Christmas party by the Alan and Carolee Lee family. They performed vocal as well as drum, guitar and other instrumental numbers. The group enjoyed this talented family who helped to put everyone in the Christmas mood. As the chapter members look back on the year they take pleasure in their successes such as the excellent July 24th celebration where they raised monies to contribute to the scholarship and the "Tomorrows Pioneers" programs. They were: Ashby (Hap) who was a crew chief of a 60 mm Mortar squad, Bob Reeve who was a squad leader in the 10th Mountain Division, Weldon Heaton who installed Bailey Bridges for the 3rd Army and Llovd Richins who was an electrician's mate on the carrier **Intrepid**. Each of these four spoke and told what life was like for them as they served their country. They talked about how difficult it was to keep clean, and get food, and how cold the winters were. We should all honor those who, in times of peril, gave of themselves that the rest of us might have the freedoms we enjoy.

JORDAN RIVER TEMPLE (Southwest Salt Lake Valley) The Christmas program for the


MAPLE MOUNTAIN




TAYLORSVILLE - BENNION


