SUP Membership Tops 2006 Members!!

The total SUP membership as of November **30** was **2,036** topping the goal of 2,006 that was established at the beginning of the year. Since June 30, there have been 62 reinstated 67 new Annual members. In addition, there have been 10 new Life members and 15 converted Life members. The new Maple Mountain chapter in Mapleton started with 13 members, 9 Annual and 4 Life, with an expectation of many more in the months We encourage all chapters to ahead. actively recruit new members, the life-blood of our organization. Several new chapters are being promoted by Area Vice Presidents and existing chapters for 2007.

2007 Dues Should be Remitted by December 31!! The Bylaws approved in 2005 require chapters to remit their dues when collected. As of November 30, only seven chapters have sent in their 2007 dues. We congratulate Lehi with 48%, Brigham Young with 41% and Eagle Rock with 33% of their annual dues remitted. We hope each chapter has established a procedure for collecting the dues and urge each Chapter President to make sure that the Treasurer has remitted the collections. Our goal is 30% of all dues remitted by December 31. As of November 30, only 13% of the 2007 dues has been received.

Third Quarter Award Report Past Due The new Chapter Awards Program requires a quarterly report from each Chapter. Forms were sent for the Third and Fourth Quarter in September. The Third Quarterly Report was due by November 15. Please make sure your report is in.
