Six 2007 Area Training Meetings have now been held and over 250 chapter officers and their boards have received instructions and training for the new year. The Area Vice Presidents and National Program Directors conducted outstanding training meetings. One or more members of the Executive Council attended each meeting. We were impressed with the quality of leadership existing within our organization.



Several **2007 National Goals** were presented at the training meetings:

- ✓ Increase SUP membership to 750 LIFE and 1,550 Annual or 2,300 TOTAL. Especially add members to smaller chapters that are struggling to keep the chapter viable.
- **✓** Add five new chapters.
- ✓ Memorialize at least 120 Pioneer ancestors.
- ✓ Each chapter has at least one **Tomorrow's Pioneer program** (Scholarship, Pioneer Biography, Frontier Essay)
- ✓ Each chapter has a **trek specialist** who conducts at least **one trek** each year. Three national treks to Mesa and an attendance over **300** at the **Convention October 18-20**.
- ✓ Each chapter has a **monument or plaque project**. **Five** new monuments completed during 2007. Complete evaluation and description of existing monuments.
- ✓ Each chapter honors at least one **Today's Pioneer**. National honors **five** Today's Pioneers at National events.

Each chapter board is encouraged to consider these national goals in establishing their specific **chapter goals** for the year.



OUTSTANDING CHAPTER NEWS

SALT LAKE CITY Chapter and the Twin Peaks Chapter merged. They now have large turn-outs. In January, **President Monson,** a member of the Chapter, spoke in

honor of two Chapter members who are now centurions: Patriarch Eldred G. Smith and Stacy Garn. The Chapter meets in the historic 10th Ward, where President Monson said his future wife was blessed as a baby. In February, Elder Erin Call, Emeritus Seventy, spoke to another large turn-out about the Mormon Colonies in Mexico. He asked: "Were the eight Mexican Mormon Colonies successful?" "From that one stake", he replied, "came 125 mission presidents, 20 temple presidents and 9 General Authorities leading to 1.3 million Mexican members and 14 temples!"

PIONEER HERITAGE installed Guy Chamberlain, retired bank examiner, as chapter president. Guy's ancestor, John, walked to the Salt Lake Valley as a 9 year-old and later composed "We Are Marching On To Glory", Hymn 225 in the LDS Hymnal. At a catered meal, Paul Fetzer spoke on "Building the Tabernacle Organ".

LEHI put a paid ad in the local newspaper advertising that Jay Smith, 2007 National President, would speak to the chapter. The Cost of the sumptuous dinner meeting, held at the historic Lehi Hotel was only \$7! New officers were installed by Keith Black. Lehi is already planning a trek to Rock Creek Hollow/ Martin's Cove and their annual Summer dinner on Antelope Island (State Park).
