
A 2009 goal for the youth is to initiate one of the suggested "Tomorrows Pioneers" programs in the public or private schools.

Brother Murphy served as an LDS mission president and is the founder of the "I Won't **Cheat" Foundation**. He gave a very inspiring message to the group on the subject of "Integrity in Sports".

SETTLEMENT CANYON (Tooele, Utah) For the January meeting of the chapter (top-right), Jim Bevan, Tooele Pioneer Museum coordinator, gave a PowerPoint presentation, which he called "The Bathtub Rings of Lake Bonneville". It was a very interesting and educational presentation. Jim pointed out not only the well-known and recognized rings on the mountainsides, but also out in the valley where they are not so easily recognized. The officers and board members were sworn in by AVP Robert Blakely (above).

**TAYLORSVILLE – BENION** (Taylorsville, Utah) The guest speaker for January was John Tippets, the author of "Hearts of Courage". The book is about John's father, Joseph Tippets, and his experiences as a survivor of an Alaska airplane crash in 1943. The plane with six on board went missing in remote Southeast Alaska. At the time of the crash the January Alaskan weather was extreme and searchers found no signs of the aircraft so all were assumed lost. Several days later, on February 3<sup>rd</sup>, the crew of a small U.S. Coast Guard vessel on a routine patrol in **Boca de Ouadra** was stunned to discover two starved and freezing survivors of the missing plane. One of those survivors was Joseph Tippets. John's story tells of the faith, courage and prayers of the survivors and their families.


